

PETER LAVEZZOLI

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Peter Lavezzoli, known for his signature style of combining old-school rock and R&B backbeats with a progressive rock and jazz edge is proficient in several musical genres including Rock, Blues, and Jazz. Rising quickly as one of the industry's most in-demand musicians for both live performances and session work, Lavezzoli joined San Francisco-based Melvin Seals & the Jerry Garcia Band as the full-time, touring drummer in 2009 where he presently continues his role. In the early '90s Lavezzoli helped found Florida's premiere Grateful Dead tribute band Crazy Fingers, where he continues his roles as both drummer and lead vocalist for the band.

Playing over 3,000 career shows to date, Lavezzoli recently performed with <u>Grateful Dead</u> members, <u>Phil Lesh</u> and <u>Bob Weir</u> (*Rolling Stone – April 2014*), and also of late lent his talents behind the kit recording drum tracks with <u>Donna Jean Godchaux</u> (*Grateful Dead, Boz Scaggs, Elvis Presley, Percy Sledge*) and <u>Jeff Mattson</u> (*Dark Star Orchestra, Zen Tricksters*) on their debut album "Back Around" released by *Heart of Gold Records* in February 2014. Lavezzoli appears regularly with <u>Bobby Lee Rodgers</u> (*Code Talkers, Colonel Bruce Hampton & the Aquarium Rescue Unit*) in both his Jazz and Indie Rock projects and recorded on Rodgers' 2011 studio album "BLR." As a testament to his versatility, Lavezzoli was recruited by recording artist and internationally acclaimed Blues guitarist-singer-songwriter <u>Albert Castiglia</u> (*Junior Wells, Sandra Hall*) for a selection of dates in support of Castiglia's album "Keepin' On" released in 2011 on *Blues Leaf Records*. Always the student, Lavezzoli has made several trips to India, where he studied with <u>Tanmoy Bose</u>, tabla player for the late <u>Ravi Shankar</u>, and has played drums in Tanmoy's Indo-jazz group <u>Taal Tantra</u> both on Indian TV and at music festivals throughout India.

Lavezzoli is a respected *music historian* and *award winning author* with two books published to date. "The King of All, Sir Duke" (Continuum Publishing, 2001) explores the legacy of Duke Ellington in modern jazz, rock, and R&B music and "The Dawn of Indian Music in the West" (Continuum Publishing, 2006) -- with a Foreword by Ravi Shankar -- tells the story of Shankar and Indian music's pivotal impact on rock and jazz. The book won the ASRC (Association for Recorded Sound Collections) award in 2007 for Best Historical Research, and was published in India by HarperCollins in 2009 with revisions and a new title: "Bhairavi: The Global Impact of Indian Music." Staying active in his passion for both the arts and education, Lavezzoli is a member of the National Academy of Recording Arts & Sciences (NARAS/GRAMMY) and the American Federation of Musicians. He is a former instructor and show director for the nationally-acclaimed School of Rock and currently accepts drum and vocal students for private lessons as his schedule permits.

All drums listed above (except for the snare) are dated 1983 from the Gretsch factory in DeQueen, Arkansas, with natural maple gloss finish and the classic 6-ply "Jasper" shells of maple and gumwood. (The previous home of this drum set was Criteria Studios in Miami, where it was used as a house kit on many recording sessions.) The Broadkaster snare drum (in solid white finish with round badge) is dated 1957 from the original Gretsch factory in Brooklyn NY, with the older 3-ply maple shell.
